

# **SUPPORT REQUESTS**


Peer support is the heart of our organization. We received 197 support requests in 2023, a 56% increase from 2022. This brings us to a total of 335 total requests since inception.

### Requests by location




#### Support pre- or post-MAID

We continue to receive more requests for support before the MAID provision and increasingly see clients wanting to stay in touch with the volunteer for some time after.




### Person supporting or grieving

She shared her maid experience and I felt grounded to talk to someone who had been through the loss of their mom and a planned death."

"I talked to 2 different volunteers, and was enormously grateful. **The** conversations helped me face my partner's decision feeling grounded and informed."




"What helped me was having someone who listened and understood what having a family member die through MAID was like. I didn't tell very many people that my mom had MAID or that she had terminal cancer because I've noticed that in general people are bad at acknowledging illness and death. This was a safe space to talk about it all. I really liked my peer counsellor - she was so kind and generous. She also really understood what grieving is like and at one point explained that crying is normal and that helped too."

# **SOCIAL MEDIA**



Our Facebook audience grew 49% in 2023 to 665 people. Overall, our audience is 89% women. We now have followers in Canada, US, UK, Australia, New Zealand, Mexico, Italy, South Africa, and Africa

# **OUTREACH**

We supported the theme of growth with many outreach activites during 2023. We connected with partner organizations and MAID programs across Canada and dispatched postcards to organizations across the country to promote MFSS and help people access support when they need it.


This outreach was reflected in significantly increased interest in what MFSS is doing. Over the course of the year we received many requests for meetings and presentations to share our insight on what support is needed for family members and loved ones when someone chooses MAID.

#### Highlights

- Met with MAID assessors, providers, and support staff from different health authorities, including Island Health and Alberta Health Services
- Connected with many hospices in BC
- Established an Atlantic MAID group with representatives from MFSS, Dying With Dignity, and MAID teams from the Maritime provinces
